Course Descriptions

BUS – Business Administration (pg. 89)

456. Senior Seminar in Business 1-3 credit hours. Recitation: 2. Laboratory: 0. Alternative Mode:1. Seminar meets to hear visiting business leaders, study and evaluate interviewing, job selection and professional advancement. Optional second hour includes a competitive business simulation, in which students make management decisions and are evaluated in terms of their market effectiveness. Students with credit for BAE 456 will not receive credit for BUS 456. Prerequisite: Senior standing.

EDU – Education (pg. 97)

345. Advanced Concept and Research Methods in Primary Education (R) (W) 3 credit hours. Recitation: 2.7. Laboratory: 0. Alternative Mode: 0.3. Teacher candidates will expand upon the action research began in EDU 320. Emphasis will be placed upon making interdisciplinary connections, supporting the learning needs of the individual students in the field placement, and implementing research in teaching and learning. There is an additional fee with this course. Prerequisites: 2.85 GPA; C- or higher in EDU 322, 323, 324.
