

## STUDY ABROAD TO DO LIST: PART 1

- 1. Notify your advisor about your interest (this helps with 4 year planning).
- 2. Keep your GPA above 2.7 (certain programs may require higher GPAs).
- 3. Notify Jenn Nye in the Financial Aid Office at <a href="mailto:inye1@heidelberg.edu">inye1@heidelberg.edu</a>.
- 4. Schedule an appointment with Julie Arnold at jarnold3@heidelberg.edu to discuss the how tos of study abroad and different programs.
- 5. Apply for a passport if you don't have a valid one.

## STUDY ABROAD TO DO LIST: PART 2

- 1. Determine which program best suits you academically, personally and financially.
- 2. Fill out a study abroad budget worksheet.
- 3. Continue to keep your GPA above 2.7 (certain programs may require higher GPAs).
- 4. Apply to the program by the deadline (typically spring-Oct 1/fall & summer-Mar 1)
- 5. After being accepted to your program, submit pre-departure documents (e.g. academic references, transcripts, **disciplinary record**, credit transfer)
- 6. Apply for visa if necessary & get shots if recommended.
- 7. Pay your Heidelberg bill and submit required documents at Heidelberg (Off-Campus Studies Request Form & Transient Student Permission Form).
- 8. Apply for scholarships if applicable.

## STUDY ABROAD TO DO LIST: PART 3

- 1. Book your flight.
- 2. Attend the Study Abroad Pre-Departure Orientation (learn how-tos about banking, phones, travel, culture shock, etc).
- 3. Research information about your destination (laws, customs, politics).
- 4. Make plans for money, phones, and charging electronic devices.
- 5. Check on your insurance.
- 6. Connect with other students who have travelled abroad for advice.
